Community Watch

Anytime you see suspicious activity – whether it's a person, a vehicle, or something that just doesn't seem normal - please call the Sheriff's office (727-2112 or 911). The more timely and specific information you can provide, the better! You may make anonymous reports if you would prefer to do so. However, if you want to speak to a sheriff, ask for it! If you want a call back, make sure the operator has all of your contact information. The more vocal we are as a community, the better response and visibility we will have with the Sheriff's office. Our Deputies **DO NOT** mind being called to investigate a situation that seems abnormal.

It is also important to **keep an eye on vacant properties** in the neighborhood and to contact the Sheriff if you see suspicious activity.

All residents with email addresses on file will receive timely updates about any criminal activity in the neighborhood. You may also contact Jen Hayden at 749-1902 or shallowford.lakes@gmail.com if you have information that needs to be shared with the neighborhood in order to keep all residents informed of criminal activity. Share this information with your neighbors in the event they do not use email.

Nissen House

Would you like to make a lasting contribution to your community that will serve generations of Lewisville residents?

The Lewisville Historical Society requests your help in making the historic George Elias Nissen House a unique and inviting space for community activities. The house, which dates from the 1870's, was built by George Elias Nissen, one of the people who contributed the most to the economic development of this area. When repair and restoration work is completed on the house, it will provide space for receptions, meetings, reunions, educational presentations, art displays and much more. Best of all, the Nissen House is located in the heart of Lewisville, within easy walking distance of Shallowford Square and easily accessible for public events.

But to make this vision a reality for Lewisville, the Historical Society needs YOUR help and the help of your neighbors! The Nissen House Project has reached a critical point: they are preparing to fill in the storm water basin in front of the house, do grading and landscaping, and restore the front façade of the house to its original appearance. The goal is to raise \$250,000 and contributions of \$5, \$10, \$20 or more toward these efforts would be a real help to the project. The Lewisville Historical Society asks for your support in its efforts and to follow the project as it progresses.
